Plot/Synopsis:

A LITTLE HEART OF MUAY THAI

Duangkhae Buaprakhon's "A LITTLE HEART OF MUAY THAI" is a documentary film telling a story of an existing Thai boxing camp in the North-Eastern province of Thailand, and the motivated boys who want to learn Muay Thai following footsteps of their native boxing hero. After retiring from K-1 Fight, BUA KAW BANCHAMEK, return to his hometown, Baan Song Nong, Sam Rong Tarb District, Surin Province, unemployed. The villagers especially the kids want so much for Buakaw to continue on his boxing career. In doubt but inspired by the kids, Buakaw decides to start a boxing camp with very limited budget he has. Unexpectedly, the villagers also support him in every way they can even though it is a considerably low income area. A small Muay Thai camp at Baan Song Nong is finally established. No one is happier than the boys at Baan Song Nong and those from villages nearby. Now they can practice Muay Thai with their hero Thai master and pursue Muay Thai as their dream career. Here, without any sponsorship or income, it's the only camp where the villagers take care these little boxers like their own family to help nourishing these little buds to be as good boxers as they can. Here, it's the only place where the kids get restricted training, but feel the freedom like a bird. Here, it's only camp that victory or defeat is not as important as their fighting hearts.
